Family Kids Night

Family Kids Night is a time when the churches of a specific section come together for a night of family ministry and fellowship. **Thank you** to our speakers, **Tim & Marcia Jones. Thank you** also to **New Life A/G, Athens** for hosting this great night in their section. I believe these Family Nights help encourage fellowship and unity in our children's ministries throughout the Alabama Sections. We currently have three more planned for 2025.

ROYAL RANGERS

Alabama Royal Rangers is having an impact across our ministry network, as well as the Church of God, Wesleyan, and Independent churches across this state under the leadership of our executive staff, led by **Rev John Robinson**.

Missionary Update – Rev John Robinson, our Alabama District Director and Missionary for Royal Rangers, has been itinerating while doing ministry. God has blessed as he has reached 73% of his required monthly support.

Frontiersmen Camping Fellowship (FCF) – Our FCF chapter continues to be one of the best chapters in the nation under the leadership of John "Jawbone" Gilmer, FCF Creek Chapter President. We accomplished a great deal this past year, remaining a 5-Star Chapter (highest level in FCF). Creek members participated in multiple workday projects at Camp Lone Eagle, including: building a covered deck at the headquarters building and building the dining pavilion next to it. Money for these projects was raised, in part, by the commanders of this ministry. We held a Royal Rangers

promotional event (Tomahawk Throwing Contest) at the Men's Encounter at SCCC for the tenth year. Our chapter always provides a nice hand-forged prize to the winner. We have 80 active members, 8 new members, and 62 attended Trace, where we had guest speaker/Missionary **Rev Brad Sasser** bring the word for us. Two from Creek Chapter attended the National FCF Rendezvous at Camp Eagle Rock, MO, where **Rev John Robinson** delivered one of the morning devotions. We had 13 attend the Riflemen Territorial Rendezvous in Pen Florida. **Rev Britt Hancock** of Mountain Gateway Ministries was the speaker. The Creek Chapter hosted an annual event called Forge & Fellowship. It is a camp for men to come and relax, get fed spiritually, and work on a forge project. Our annual missions auction raised \$2,561 which is used to support two full time missionaries monthly.

The Green Mountain Brigade, a service arm of the Creek Chapter FCF, had members travel to Burningtown Gap, NC where they provided a Trail Blessing to the hikers of the Appalachian Trail. They set up a primitive camp, which was a huge draw to the hikers. The Brigade provided hot food (3 meals each day), fruit, sodas, a water point, candy bars, a warm fire, and plenty of fellowship. For the last couple of years, the group has been joined by **Rev Brad Sasser**, Missionary to the Appalachian Trail. This environment presented great opportunities to share Jesus. The Brigade is the only group of its kind that takes the ambiance of the FCF and ministers to travelers from all over the world on the trail. This was their 7th year.

District Camps – This year at The Great Science Adventure (Alabama's Powwow), at Camp Lone Eagle, we had over 300 in attendance. This was the largest attendance in quite a few years. The speaker was **Rev. Russell Smith**, KidMin Director for Georgia. His messages really ministered to the boys. The altar was filled with 50 boys on opening night who yielded to the call for salvation. The second night saw 20 boys come forward for the infilling of the Holy Spirit.

The Great Legendary Adventure was held at Camp Eutopia in Springville, AL. We had 115 in attendance, with 11 salvations, 6 rededications, and 5 called into the ministry, under speakers **Rev Chris Bartlett** and **Rev Kyle Rabb**.

Lone Eagle Academy (LEA): Alabama's Junior Leadership Development Academy (JLDA) — Our academy had some first this year. We held the first ever Shooting Sports Action Camp, first ever Aquatics Action Camp, which focused on sailing, and had the largest academy that we have ever had, impacting 53 boys at 6 camps. 35 men volunteered as Staff. We also had three of our Rangers that were presented Alabama's LEA Saber for completing 4 of our camps. Alabama's Special Forces (the elite service arm of RRs) inducted 9 new boys and commanders into their ranks.

All of that is great but the highlight of LEA was the Friday night service with speaker **Rev Mike Woods**, a former Gold Medalist and Special Forces member. The altar time was powerful. It began with leaders praying over boys. Then as boys began hugging each other and praying for one another approximately 20 boys were baptized in the Holy Spirit.

National Shooting Sports Program (NSSP) – We established a shooting sports program for our Network, headed by Commander **John Brown**, a nationally certified shooting instructor and Range Safety Officer. Conducting several training courses, we were able to impact 14 boys and 11 leaders. These included two NRA/NMLRA Muzzleloading Rifle Safety Courses, a Shooting Sports Action

Camp (SSAC), an NRA Basic Rifle Shooting Course, an NRA Basic Shotgun Shooting Course, and an NRA Range Safety Officer Course. Four .22 Rifle Ranges and a Shotgun Range allowed boys to learn about firearm safety and enjoy shooting (The Great Science Adventure, The Great Legendary Adventure, Old Fashioned Farm Day, and SSAC).

John Brown also participated in the Southeast Region Royal Rangers Conference in SC where he earned his Basic Archery Instructor Trainer (BAIT) certification. From that certification he was able to teach and certify 15 Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) students from across the southeast.

Camp Lone Eagle Improvements – Thanks to Skip Terry and his crew, the headquarters building has a new sink, new back door, two new AC window units, a large upright freezer, a new-to-us chest freezer, and a covered back deck. The shed behind the headquarters building has been emptied and was used as a bunkhouse during our Academy. Trash and junk left around the shed has been hauled off, though more remains to be done. Due to the hard work of gathering funds and his coordination efforts, Jason Vawter, orchestrated development of a 4000 sqft pavilion. The pavilion came about because of the vision of Rev John Robinson and Rev Vint Norris. Many have supported financially to make it happen and Pastor Vint Norris personally saw the job finished with the help of some men from Teen Challenge.

John Brown's team installed 4 permanent benchrest shooting positions at the Rifle Range on Camp Lone Eagle. These were immediately used to facilitate shooting from the benchrest position at The Great Science Adventure.

Leaders Training - Thirteen instructors traveled across our Network to four locations to teach 61 adults at five Royal Rangers Leadership training sessions: Ranger Essentials (RE) at Life of Faith Church, Saraland 1st AG, Clanton 1st AG and Ranger Foundations (RF) and RE at Lake City AG. All Royal Rangers Leadership training is by instructors certified by National Royal Rangers. These men and women volunteer their time and resources to travel and teach, in addition to their volunteer work as Royal Rangers leaders and lay leadership at the local church. Jason Vawter, Bruce Willis, and Wayne Wilson have been utilized as instructors at several National Training events across the Southeast Region in addition to their active involvement as RF and RE instructors in the Alabama Network. This is a great honor for Alabama Instructors to be invited on a national stage. Also, two additional commanders are in training to become Certified Instructors (CI) within the next year.

AL LEAD Conference – LEAD Conference had 25 in attendance, with **Rev Jonathan** and **Brittany Hollingsworth**, Missionaries to Montenegro, as speakers.

AG Leaders Conference – We had 2 Commanders represent Alabama at the AG Leaders Conference in Branson, MO.

National Recognition — This year we had 10 boys receive national awards. Teddy Brust and Timothy Church earned the National Trail of the Saber award. Very few boys earn this award and only 6 from Alabama have previously attained this honor over the 11 years of the award.

District Recognition - Alabama's Mighty Man Award - This year Alabama's Mighty Man award was presented to **Rene' Vawter** for his exceptional support to Alabama RRs.

Lone Eagle Leadership Award - The FCF staff recognized **Jason Vawter** for his exceptional leadership and sacrificial service to RRs with the Lone Eagle Leadership Award that is given annually.

Still Going – Royal Rangers in Alabama continues to be one of the best in the nation. Our boys and leaders are constantly being recognized at the regional and national levels. We continue to be a ministry you can be proud of. Thank you for your support.

What an awesome time we had at Girls Camp 2024! We had 323 in attendance from 22 Alabama churches. For several of those, this was their first-time attending Girls Camp. The girls had a lot of fun participating in the daily activities like, the Spa, Pajama Pancake Palooza, "Glo Nights" in the Rec Hall, Tie Dye and Painting workshops, the Giant Swing and Zipline, and more. Our theme this year was **Fear is Not Your Future** with the scripture verse being Proverbs 31:25.

- Over a 10-year period Alabama is 5th in the Nation in per capital giving.
- 42% of our Alabama churches participate in BGMC giving.
- Alabama is 3rd in our division in BGMC giving.
- In the past 10 years we have seen a 124% growth in our giving to BGMC.

All CHURCH MINISTRIES SUMMIT (ACMS) - 145 IN ATTENDANCE,

All Church Ministries Summit was held at Montgomery First A/G on August 15-17, 2024. We had 145 in attendance, and our speakers were Mike Santiago, Lead Pastor of Focus Church in North Carolina, and A/G National CE Director, Elly Marroquin.

REGIONAL AMN CONFERENCE – We had approximately 135 people attend the BGMC lunch at each location, and a total of \$59,260 was pledged for BGMC from our Alabama Churches and Pastors.

<u>THE GATHERING</u> – This year the Alabama KidMin Department provided children's ministry to the Alabama Ministers children at The Gathering. Pastor Tim & Marcia Jones and their team ministered to the children using characters, music, games and puppets while the pastors and wives received ministry.

<u>CONVOY OF HOPE RAISE WORKSHOPS</u> – Instead of having one RAISE workshop in December at the. SCCC, we have brought the workshops to different parts of the state. Two were held this year, one at Ozark First A/G, Pastor Brian Presley, and the other at New Life A/G in Athens, Pastor Jason Parnell. Approximately 20 churches/ministries were represented between both workshops. If you have not attended a workshop, I would encourage you to take time out and attend one. The workshop teaches strategies and ideas to help churches reach out to their communities and win them for Jesus.

<u>DISASTER RELIEF 2024</u> - Several communities were hit very hard with Hurricane Helena. The hardest hit areas were Florida and North Carolina. The Alabama Ministry Network, through the help of many churches in our network, was able to send over \$23,000 for supplies, and several teams of workers were sent to these areas. We are thankful to all that participated with the relief efforts.

EMPOWER COMMUNITY CHAPLAINCY – We are excited about this new ministry opportunity. **Mission/Vision**:

To provide a formal training program to assist rural pastors in becoming incarnational leaders, and finally Community Chaplains

This study is centered around the training preparation for rural pastors to enter the many faith and non-faith homes, hospitals, and workplaces that are frequently a part of their regular services. It highlights the necessity for pastors to be equipped with the skills and training to minister effectively. This study aims to compel pastors towards formal credentialing. With adequate training and credentialing, they will be able to minister with a listening ear and direct people toward the knowledge of our heavenly Chaplain, Jesus Christ, ultimately transforming their lives and the lives of those around them.

Goals:

Objective 1: Develop strategies to help rural pastors implement shalom, incarnational, and servant leadership relationships in their communities.

Objective 2: To provide training in chaplaincy care and the theories of caring for people facing daily moral, ethical, and quality-of-life decisions.

Objective 3: To develop an understanding of Missio Dei, the mission of God, which means "God is a missionary God." This principle is the foundation of chaplaincy, "to go," to be among those who are hungry and searching.

Objective 4: To gain an understanding of the terrain he or she will be working, symbolically speaking, the world of community economics, infrastructures, and community politics.

Objective 5: To gain a greater understanding of one's calling and to understand the desirable skills, knowledge, attitudes, and practices necessary for chaplains to be competent to accept the mandate to message the gospel out to the community.
